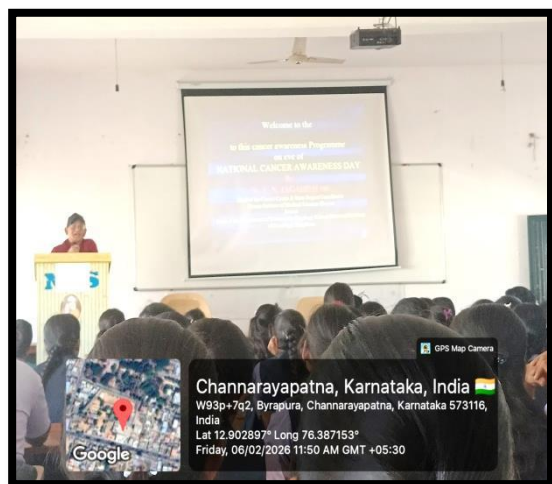
COMMEMORATING NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL EVENTS



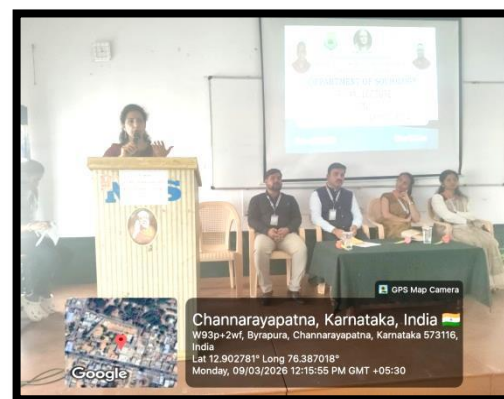
